2	eccliastical.
3	Q Mr. Morrill (BADRINARAYAN DAS)
4	A I hope that wasn't too long-winded.
5	Q Not at all.
6	I'm going to show you what I'd like to be
7	marked as Plaintiffs' Exhibit 12 for identification.
8	(ISKCON letter was marked as Plaintiffs'
9	Exhibit 12 for identification.)
10	Q Mr. Morrill, I'm showing you what's been
11	marked as Plaintiffs' Exhibit 12 for identification and
12	ask you to take a look at this document. And when
13	you're finished, tell me if you recognize it.
14	A Yes, I do.
15	Q And what is it?
16	A This, as I said, in 1970, this is Prabhupada,
17	the founder of our society, founding the GBC. It's a
18	letter inviting them all to come together and start this
19	GBC, Governing Body Commission. It's when he set up the
20	ultimate managing authority.
21	MR. LESTER: I move Plaintiffs' Exhibit 12
22	into evidence.
23	MR. CHITTUR: Objection, Judge. This witness
24	was not even a member of the GBC until 17 years
25	later, number one. Number two, the document is

And, number three, it's on the issue 3 -- both authenticity as well as relevance. 4 Somebody told something else to somebody else in 5 1977. 6 We object to the introduction of this document 7 on all three grounds. 8 MR. LESTER: Your Honor, this is the direction 9 of management that establishes the GBC and talks 1.0 about its authority. It can come in under a number 11 of different bases. I think the easiest one is 12 under the ancient documents rule -- it is a 13 document that is over 30 years old -- as a 14 certificate of authenticity of the keeper of the 15 documents in the archives. And --16 THE WITNESS: I was living in L.A. when 17 Prabhupada mentioned that this was happening. 18 was there when it happened. 19 MR. LESTER: And, again, it's directly 20 relevant to the authority of the Governing Body 21 Commission, which is a plaintiff in this action, 22 over the religious corporation. It comes in under 23 the ancient documents, rule without a doubt. 24 THE COURT: May I see the document, please? 25

3	THE COURT: Well, this document is notarized,
4	apparently, by the
5	MR. LESTER: By the keeper of the documents.
6	THE COURT: the director of preservation,
7	who identifies himself as the keeper of these
8	documents; is that right?
9	MR. LESTER: Yes, your Honor.
10	MR. CHITTUR: Judge
11	MR. LESTER: These are archive documents.
12	MR. CHITTUR: Your Honor, it is a document
13	concerning another corporation in California. It's
14	International Society of Krishna Consciousness,
15	Inc. It's in Los Angeles, California.
16	THE COURT: We'll accept it into evidence for
17	whatever relevance it may have here. You'll have
18	an opportunity to cross-examine the witness on the
19	document and, obviously, any other aspect of his
20	testimony.
21	Mark it into evidence, please.
22	(Plaintiffs' Exhibit 12, previously marked for
23	identification, was received and marked into
24	evidence.)
25	MR. LESTER: Could you show it to the witness,

3	Q Mr. Morrill, if you could turn to the fourth
4	page of the direction of management part of that
5	document. Directing your attention to paragraph number
6	1 where it's under the title particulars of the
7	Governing Body Commission. Do you see that?

9	Q And could you describe for the Court what
10	paragraph number 1 provides?
11	A What paragraph number provides? Should I read
12	it or explain it?
13	Q Just explain to the Court the meaning of that
14	paragraph as you understand it?
15	A It says the GBC oversees all operations and
16	management of ISKCON. The GBC is the final Court. If
17	someone's not satisfied with a local temple president
18	then they refer it to the local GBC member. If the
19	local GBC member can't resolve it, if it's in North
20	America, it goes to our northern American GBC body,
21	twice year. If the North American GBC can't resolve it,
22	then it goes to the international GBC. Whatever the
23	international GBC decides, that's it.
24	Does that answer your question?
25	Q Yes, it does.

3	number 6
4	A And I should mention that this document is
5	quoted, it is referenced, it is well known. It's the
6	basis of the decisions, the basis of our authority.
7	Q It's a historical document?
8	A Historical document that's referred to
9	repeatedly.
10	Q Look at paragraph number 6 for a moment.
11	A Okay.
12	Q And, again, in your own words, describe for
13	the Court your understanding of the meaning of that
14	paragraph.
15	A This says the primary objective of the GBC is
16	to organize the opening of new temples and to maintain
17	the established temples.
18	\mathbb{Q} What is your understanding of maintaining the
19	established temples?
20	A I asked Srila Prabhupada, the founder of the
21	Hare Krishna movement, when I was a temple president, I
22	said what does it mean to be one of your officers? He
23	said it means if anything goes
24	MR. CHITTUR: Objection, Judge, hearsay.
25	THE WITNESS: It's personal experience.

What this means is that the GBC is 5 A responsible to establish and maintain temples. 6 maintain means that they're fiscally sound, that they're 7 ministering to their congregation properly. Buildings 8 are maintained. It's a franchise. They should --9 philosophically and as far as maintenance and finances 10 should be solid. And that's their duty. And we've 11 removed GBC members that don't do their job. 12 Very good. O 13 Are you also familiar with a document that's 14 known as the declaration of will of the founder? 1.5 This is Prabhupada's last will and testament? A 16 Yes. 17 O Yes, I'm well aware of it. 18 A And could you describe for the Court what your 19 Q understanding of that document is and its meaning to the 20 Krishna Consciousness movement? 21 Well, in that document he establishes two 22 A He establishes the GBC as the ultimate managing 23 authority, his exact words, and he also establishes a 24 trustee system, because he wanted to make sure that --25

8	THE COURT: Sustained.
9	MR. LESTER: No further questions, your Honor.
10	THE COURT: Thank you. Cross-examination?
11	THE WITNESS: Do I give this to somebody.
12	THE COURT: That will be returned to counsel.

14	BY MR. CHITTUR:
15	Q Drawing your attention to Plaintiffs' Exhibit
16	12 and exhibit 13?
17	MR. CHITTUR: Would you please show the
18	witness these documents, please. 12 first.
19	Q We have no evidence that anything that is
20	stated in here was filed with the Secretary of State in
21	New York; is that correct?
22	A I don't know.
23	Q We have no evidence that any part of this
24	document was ever adopted by the plaintiff corporation
25	in New York. Is that correct?

3	Q Now, let's take a look at Plaintiffs' Exhibit
4	13. Again, we have no evidence that any part of this
5	document was filed with the Secretary of State in
6	connection with the plaintiff corporation in New York;

9	world by all of our temples for the
10	Q Let's answer my question. We have no evidence
11	saying that this document or any part of this document
1.2	was filed with the Secretary of State in connection with
13	the plaintiff corporation in New York?
14	A I don't know.
15	Q We have no evidence that any portion of this
16	document, Plaintiffs' Exhibit 13, was adopted by the
17	plaintiff corporation in New York; is that correct?
18	A We know that it followed all of its
19	principles.
20	Q Let's answer my question.
21	A Otherwise I never would have written that
22	letter. So we know that it was being followed.
23	MR. CHITTUR: Move to strike, Judge.
24	Q Let's answer my question.
25	THE COURT: If you would, kindly answer the
